Project Update

The scheme is now reaching completion and we are grateful to local stakeholders and the public for their patience during the works. The photographs below show the improvements made to date.



Care for the natural environment is key and the removal of the hedge along the road at the start of the scheme has been carefully managed. Griffiths appoint specialist contractors to assist with hedgerow relocation and reinstatement. Whilst it is the intention for the old hedge to regrow in its new location supplementary planting may be necessary. These works will be carried out on completion of the stockproof fencing. In addition to working with environmental consultants Griffiths employs a team of ecologists to ensure wildlife habitats are not disturbed and where necessary are managed in line with legislative requirements.
