

Project Overview



Griffiths was appointed by Conwy County Borough Council to carry out work on the Old Colwyn Coastal Defence Project in March 2021. This work targets the section of Old Colwyn Promenade most at risk of collapse – the eastern section between Rotary Way and Splash Point (by Old Colwyn Arches), and includes:

- Installation of rock armour to protect the sea wall and promenade
- Extending the existing culvert at Splash Point
- Protecting the Dŵr Cymru/Welsh Water outfall
- Provision of a new fishing platform at Splash Point
- Improved beach access structures
- Improved access over existing rock groynes on the beach
- Construction of a new sea wall
- Raising the level of the promenade

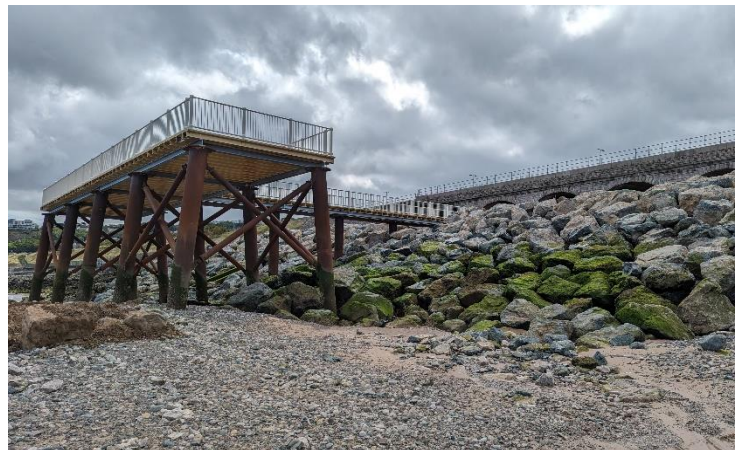

Project Progress – Beach Works

To date, we have completed 720m of rock revetment which involved importing 135,000 tonnes of rock armour to the site. New culverts have been constructed along with outfall protection slabs.

The new fishing platform has been completed, along with installation of rock armour around it. A new access ramp to the fishing platform and new access steps onto the beach are in the final stages of construction.

We are considering a number of options to enable the public to access the new fishing platform prior to overall completion of the project and hope to be able to do so over the coming weeks. However, we must ensure that all necessary works are completed to provide safe access whilst works on the promenade continue.



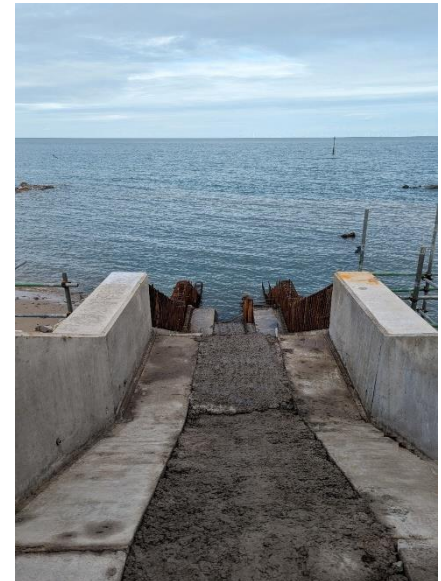

This set of photographs shows the progress being made on construction of the new beach access steps, the new sea wall and the ongoing works to raise the level of the promenade by around 1.5 metres (5 feet).

Approximately 400m of new wall has been constructed to date along with 5,500 tonnes of fill material imported to progress the overall promenade raising.
